DECLARATORY WORDS

According to the law of this Country, marriage is the union of two people, voluntarily entered into for life, to the exclusion of all others.

I must now ask each of you to declare that you know of no legal reason why you should not be married to each other.

CONTRACTING WORDS

Ladies and gentlemen, family and friends, we have now come to the most important part of the ceremony, the formal vows of marriage and the exchange of rings.

The wearing of a wedding ring is the ancient and traditional seal of a marriage. The wedding ring is an unbroken circle that symbolises unending and everlasting love, a circle that has no beginning and no end.

I give you this ring as a symbol of our marriage and I promise to care for you give you my love and friendship support and comfort you and to respect and cherish you throughout our lives together.

You have symbolised your marriage by the joining of hands and the giving and receiving of rings in the presence of your witnesses, family and friends gathered here today. It's not one moment, it's every moment. Big ones like saying "I love you," having your children, moving in together, getting engaged, getting married here today — but mostly a million little ones that come in between the big moments.
